BLOOD DRIVE UPDATES

The Port Huron Elks Lodge 343, 54th consecutive Blood drive information. We had (31) donors register, (8) donors were deferred, and (24) whole blood pints collected. This included (2 Power reds = 4 pints) for a total of 28 pints collected. We had 5 first time donors and (??) type O donors who arrived to provide the "Gift of Life". With the support of Lodge 343, the American Red Cross, has collected over 1,839 units (pints) = 229 plus gallons of blood since our 1st blood drive on January 7, 2013. We are well on our way to reaching our next goal of 2,000 pints (250 gallons).

Our 55th Blood Drive has been scheduled for Monday, October 16th. To date, we currently have 20 appointments booked for the American Red Cross. Please consider registering today at <https://www.redcross.org>.

In order to be eligible to advance, a contestant must have participated in and won the previous level. #6 - The participant does not have to be family member of a Port Huron Elks Lodge 343 members.
