MARIJUANA USE PROHIBITED ON LODGE PREMISES

The Board of Directors, and House Committee of the Port Huron Elks Lodge 343 has had an increasing number of complaints from members of marijuana use on club property.

The Michigan Marijuana Act Section 333.27954 (e) prohibits the use of marijuana in a "public place" or where prohibited by the owner/manager(s) of said property (i.e., the Port Huron Elks Lodge and property). As such any member reported will be referred to law enforcement for investigation and subsequent penalties.

Also, PGER Ronald Hicks in a memo dated November 14, 2018 has advised that the smoking of marijuana products in, on or about lodge property (including the grounds, parking areas, and all other outside areas of the club) will be deemed a violation of the Obligation and Conduct Unbecoming of an Elk, and will be subject to discipline under the Laws of the Order.

We continue to strive to give this lodge a safe, inviting and family atmosphere for all of our members.







VETERANS CORNER #21 - The Benevolent and Protective Order (BPOE) of the Elks of the United States of America Cardinal Virtues (Principles)
