*Grand Lodge (original verbiage) Section 16.090: All Homes, Clubs, Club Rooms, and Parlors shall be closed during the hours of all regular and special meetings of the Lodge, except those facilities thereof designated for the use of and then being used only by the non-Member spouses and minor children of the Members of the Lodge, and caregivers or drivers of disabled Lodge Members, providing the use does not interfere with the proper functioning of the Lodge meeting. Any Lodge violating this Section under any pretext whatever shall be liable to a forfeiture of its Charter.

**Section 16.090: By amending its By-Laws, a Lodge may adopt a policy to allow Homes, Clubs, Club Rooms, and Social Parlors to remain open during the hours of regular and special meetings of the Lodge, provided the use does not interfere with the proper function of the Lodge meeting. Any Member or guest engaging in loud or boisterous conduct that interferes with the proper function of such meeting shall be subject to charges under GLS 16.041 for Conduct Unbecoming of an Elk.
