## 42nd Annual Blood Drive

Port Huron Elks Lodge 343 held our 41st consecutive Blood drive on August 16th. We had 38 donors registered with 3 donors deferred and 29 whole blood pints collected (5 Power reds = 10 pints) for 39 total units which were collected which is 108% of our goal. We also had one first time donor and 14 Type "O" donors who arrived to provide the "Gift of Life". With Lodge 343 supporting the American Red Cross, we have collected over 1,375 units (pints) = 171 plus gallons of blood since our 1st blood drive on January 7, 2013. Thank you to Kelly Dunsmore from Memphis, MI, who volunteered her service hours for Grad School assisting at the sign in table and step-down area. Our 42nd Blood Drive on MONDAY, September 26th currently has 11 appointments booked! Thank you all for such a productive drive in August.

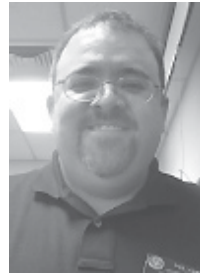

## GRAND LODGE RESOLUTION VOTING RESULTS - ATLANTA, GA

- #1 - To add the Secretary and Treasurer to the Board of Directors - PASSED
- #2 - To reduce the burden of storage of hundreds of years of physical paperwork by allowing for digital storage of documents PASSED
- #3 - To eliminate the age requirement in part (a) of Section 14.260. - PASSED
- #4 - To create, establish and codify a new Elks National Drug Awareness Commission, to better support and promote the programs of the Order. - PASSED
- #5 - To provide the GER with the ability to protect Members, guests, and property when a Member acts or threatens to act in an egregious manner. - PASSED
- #6 - The purpose of this amendment to clarify that there is no charge for the issuance of identification cards. - PASSED
- #7 - The purpose of this amendment is to ensure that the GER has sufficient time to analyze the objections made by a Member, Lodge or State Association that are subject to an executive order. - PASSED
- #8 - The purpose of this amendment is to provide authority for local Lodge Committees and Subcommittees to meet by electronic means. - PASSED.
- #9 - The purpose of this amendment is to authorize the GER or District Deputy to allow electronic meetings to protect Members from a serious threat to their health and safety and to ensure the continuation of Lodge business. - PASSED
- #10 - The purpose of this amendment is to clarify that an unaffiliated Member, who is the current spouse of a Member, may visit a Lodge and attend events of the Order in a manner consistent with the status of a spouse who has never been a Member of the Order. - PASSED
- #11 - The purpose of this amendment is to authorize electronic submittal of forms in the permitting process. - PASSED

## VETERANS CORNER #20 - ALL MILITARY BRANCHES

In last month's Veterans Corner article #19 we discussed the United States National Guard, this month we will conclude with listing all of our Military Branches.

So, what is the military? The U.S. Armed Forces are made up of the 6 military branches: The proper military flag order was prescribed on October 31, 1977, by the U.S. Dept. of Defense Directive 1005.8 where it states that from left to right, the prescribed peacetime military branch flag order is: Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, Space Force and the National Guard. There are 3 general categories of military people: active duty (full-time soldiers and sailors), reserve & guard forces, veterans and retirees.

The Military is made up of 6 branches, each with their own active-duty and part-time components. Each varies in service commitment, location and how its members contribute to the overall mission of protecting our country, though all components are on the same rank-based pay scale.

1) Army and Army Reserve, the dominant land power. The Army generally moves into an area, secures it and instills order and values before it leaves. It also guards U.S. installations and properties throughout the world.

2) Army National Guard is an elite group of warriors who dedicate a portion of their time to serving their nation. Each state has its own Guard and in fact, it is the only branch of the military whose existence actually is required by the Constitution.

3) Marine Corps and Marine Corps Reserve, which is known as the country's rapid-reaction force. They are trained to fight by sea and usually are the first "boots on the ground." Marines are known as the world's fiercest warriors.

4) Navy and Navy Reserve, The Navy accomplishes its missions primarily by sea but also by air and land. It secures and protects the oceans around the world to create peace and stability, making the seas safe for travel and trade.

5) Air Force and Air Force Reserve, the nation's source of air and space power. The primary mission of the USAF is to fly planes, helicopters and satellites. Coast Guard and Coast Guard Reserve, the Coast Guard's mission is primarily with domestic waterways. The Coast Guard does rescues, law enforcement, drug prevention and clears waterways. Air National Guard, the Air National Guard, as we know it today, is a separate reserve component of the United States Air Force.

6) Space Force, the newest branch of the military, the U.S. Space Force, was signed into law in December 2019. The Space Force currently does not have a reserve component. The sixth branch of the military, the Space Force is also still in development and will be for some time as many final decisions are made, including uniforms, basing and even recruitment.
