of our order, Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity. This month it is Justice, which is defined by, "the principle or ideal of right action, the maintenance or administration of what is just, especially by the impartial adjustment of conflicting claims or the assignment of merited rewards or punishments."

When you take your oath, part of your obligation is from the Loyal Knights charge, "You have sworn to support the Constitution and comply with the Laws of this Order and the By-Laws of this Lodge. Justice requires that your observance of that Obligation should be full and complete. But the Order of Elks not only exacts from you the strict performance of the duties of membership; it likewise bestows upon you cherished rights and privileges which its whole power and authority will ensure and protect."

This weekend I had to remind some people about our rules, contrary to the belief of some, I don't like doing it, but I will without hesitation. I was accused of being too harsh, it was not my intent, and if you feel that way I apologize. Rules are put in place to protect people; they are a guide for our conduct and actions and I will enforce them. Not because I want to "throw my weight around" as I've been accused of, because I took an oath, "In the presence of God and this Lodge of Elks, I solemnly promise and swear to conform with and maintain the Constitution, Statutes, Rules and Regulations of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and the By-Laws of Lodge No. 343; to practice the virtues of Charity, Justice and Brotherly Love and with Fidelity to perform the duties of the office for which I have been chosen to the best of my ability."

I would like to thank my officers and board of directors. You guys bring me up, you give me hope, and I can't thank you enough for everything you do. People rarely see all of the great things you do for the good of the lodge, without agenda or prejudice, with noble intentions and right action. Finally thank you members, all of your words of encouragement, and support, it means the world to all of us. I was accused the other day of trying to change the lodge. That I will not deny, we (as a board, a staff, and a membership) will make it a better place than it has ever been. Keep the ideas coming, constructive criticism with good solutions is always welcome, and positive people bring about positive outcomes.

In closing again, I ask that we strive to be good to each other, hold each other up, be reminded of our oath, and practice the cardinal principles of our order, Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity. After all, "who's got it better than us, Nobody!"

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VETERANS CORNER #32 - FLAG DAY SERVICE

With honor the Port Huron Elks Lodge 343 handles the duties of the annual Flag Day service while celebrating the history of our nation's flags. Flag Day is June 14th which celebrates the symbolism and history of the American Flag. The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks has celebrated the holiday since the early days of the organization and allegiance to the flag is a requirement of every member. In 1907, the BPOE Grand Lodge designated by resolution June 14 as Flag Day. The Grand Lodge of the Order adopted mandatory observance of the occasion by every Lodge in 1911, and that requirement continues. The Elks prompted President Woodrow Wilson to recognize the Order's observance of Flag Day for its patriotic expression. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day. On August 3, 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. Thank you to Elks Lodge 343 Officers, Past Exalted Rulers, St. Clair County Honor Guard and guest in attendance for your support while attending this annual event.

The Port Huron Elks Lodge 343 has partnered with the local St. Clair County DVA by providing them with Backpacks, Food, Health and Hygiene products, Fleece Blankets, Winter apparel and other cold weather gear for our local homeless Veterans, Active-duty Military and other Veterans in need. These provisions will help our local Veterans stay healthy, safe, warm, and dry during the frigid Michigan Winter months. The backpacks are put together for the Homeless/Housing Insecure Veterans and contain clothing items, toiletries, gift cards for

food, referrals for emergency services, etc. Due to the national homeless crisis for veterans, our local Veterans Affairs office continually supply our local Veterans with clothing essentials. This is only made possible with the continued donations from individuals and organizations such as our Fraternal Order of Elks. Over and above this Freedom Grant award, our Lodge Members continually provide blankets, hats, gloves, health and hygiene products to our local veterans' organizations.
