Being Exalted Ruler is a double-edged sword, both good and bad, more on that to follow. Rather than just a here's what's going on at the lodge this month newsletter I've tried to include some kind of message in each of my monthly addresses and it usually revolves around something that was current and has a message of Elkdom.

Last week I had the distinct honor of officiating the lodge of sorrow for Brian Seely. It was good that we honored our brother with the ritual but it also filled us with grief. Brian and Deb have been staple members of our couple's league for many years. When you saw you were playing them on the schedule you were always happy because it was going to be a great two and half hours with people whose company you always enjoyed. Brian was an Elks, Elk, he embodied the principals of our order, Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity, and we will miss him greatly. 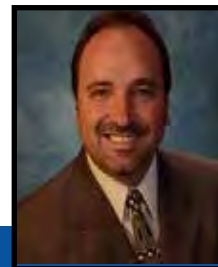

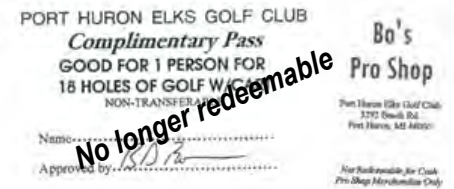
